Dear friends,

Every year, we assist thousands of older adults and people with disabilities, and their caregivers, with a range of services to help them remain at home and engaged in the community. This year required significant efforts to sustain funding that was at risk, we advocated regionally and nationally – thank you to all our partners and supporters that joined us in our advocacy. Because of you, we can continue our work supporting older adults, filling gaps in services, developing new strategies, strengthening the aging network, and thinking creatively about how we can help older adults and people with disabilities age in place.

Last year, we provided our expertise to 15,000 individuals. Here are the highlights:

Support to Live at Home

3,775 older adults and individuals with disabilities were able to remain at home through care management or self-directed services.

9,745 callers received information about community resources and benefit programs.

12,784 people received education to support their independence in the community, in-person or through written material.

4,112 individuals received nutrition support through benefit and community programs.

Caring for Loved Ones

4,024 family caregivers were assisted with information about community resources and benefits, provided with respite care, or received training.

67 family caregivers attended a caregiver conference sponsored by AOASCC.

Staying Active & Healthy

204 works by **63** artists were displayed at our annual Art of Aging Exhibition.

219 volunteers served in the community through AOASCC programs & **63** additional volunteers served as CHOICES team members and in-office support.

Support for Professionals

245 professionals were provided education regarding elder abuse and fraud through the annual conference TEARS & **42** unduplicated professionals participated in **6** Interagency Council education programs.

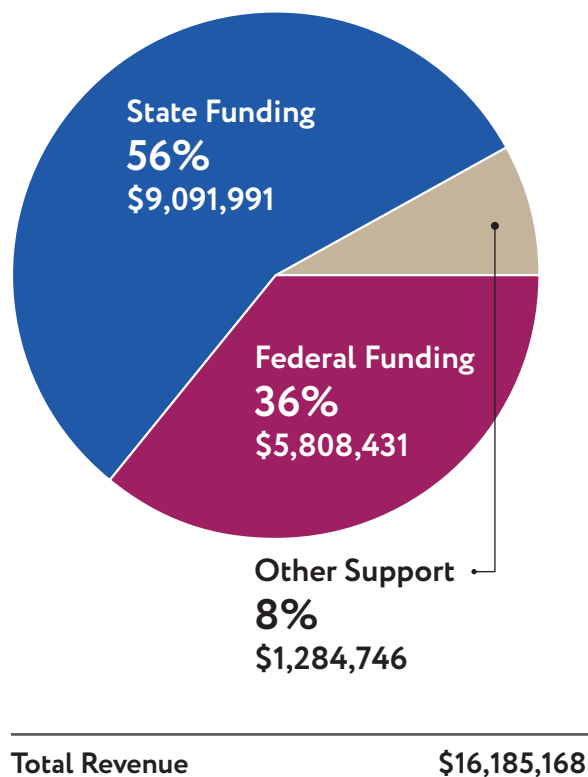
