Debbie Pausig, LMFT, CT, is a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, a Certified Thanatologist, Hospice Bereavement Coordinator for Home Care Plus Community Healthcare & Hospice, and NHPCO Bereavement Professional Steering Committee Member.

In May 2022 she presented at the New England Home care & Hospice Conference and in 2021 she was the closing Keynote Speaker for the 2021 Hospice and Palliative Care Summit sponsored by the Connecticut Association for Healthcare at Home.

She was a Professional Support Group Leader for HDSA CT-Chapter, Speaker and Trainer for 9 years. She is a National Speaker and Author of "An Affaiß Worth Remembering With Huntington's Disease, *Incurable Love & Intimacy During an Incurable Illness*."

In 2020 her article, "*Grief Amplified + Mourning Interrupted= Mourning COVID-19 Style*" was featured in Trauma Matters: Summer 2020, COVID-19 Edition a publication of the Connecticut Women's Consortium.

She was also featured on the cover of North Haven Neighbors magazine in October 2019.

In 2014, she self-published her book, "An Affair Worth Remembering With Huntington's Disease, Incurable Love & Intimacy During an Incurable Illness. It was made an ebook in 2016.

In 2013, she published a reflective article, "Grieving Behind the Badge, We are the First Responders" for ADEC's publication, The Forum. A reflection on the Sandy Hook Tragedy.

In 2008, Debbie was trained by Sr. Mauryeen O'Brien, O.P, to facilitate the New Day Program for the bereaved which she presented for 7 years at St. Frances Cabrini Church in North Haven. Under Sr. Mauryeen's tutelage, she trained future facilitators and conducted workshops in grief in Connecticut.
